Getting More Out of Reading the Bible - STEP 1

- 1) Have a place and a plan
- 2) Choose a faithful translation that suits you (NKJ, ESV, CSB, NIV)
- 2) Skim headings to get a content awareness for the surrounding text
- 3) Try to read a specific chunk / whole book in one sitting & reread
- 4) Read through whole books

(5) Keep in Mind Big Picture:
